Health and Hunger Project

UniCare and Think Kids have partnered together to begin taking a closer look at how important the relationship is between our health care system and community hunger outreach programs. *The Health* and Hunger Project was created to begin the dialogue around this issue and to find ways to connect our healthcare and access to healthy food. *The* **Health and Hunger Summit Series** is a four week virtual event where a panel of experts from around the state will be discussing this issue. The series began on September 22 and will run every Tuesday morning from 10:00-11:30 until October 16th.

Session One - The State of Health and Hunger in West Virginia uncovers the current condition of our state. Session Two - Health and Hunger from the *Health Care Provider's Perspective* identifies the challenges provider's face in addressing hunger. Session Three - Health and Hunger from the Community Resource Provider's Perspective will focus on the accessibility of community food banks. Session Four - **Bringing Health and Hunger Resources to the Same Table** will promote ideas for positive policy change.
